Developing emergency response plans
Identifying emergency situations and appropriate responses

Session 6: Health and Wellness

Identifying health and wellness concerns in waste and sanitation work
Understanding the importance of hygiene and sanitation in waste and sanitation work
Identifying resources for addressing health and wellness concerns
